Elections for Delegates to AFSCME Council 25 Convention Scheduled

Elections for delegates to the semi-annual AFSCME Council 25 Convention will take place at the membership meeting on Wednesday, September 3rd. AFSCME 411 is entitled to representation by five delegates. Delegate representation is determined by the number of members in a local. By virtue of office, the president of a local is an automatic delegate to the convention. Four additional delegates will be elected at the September 3rd meeting. To be able to be nominated as a delegate you must be a member in good standing for one year. The convention will be held from Thursday, October 9th until Sunday, October 12th. The convention will take place at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Dearborn, Michigan. The local will pay for accommodations on Saturday night for elected delegates and will also pay for admission to the banquet on Saturday night. Other events in-

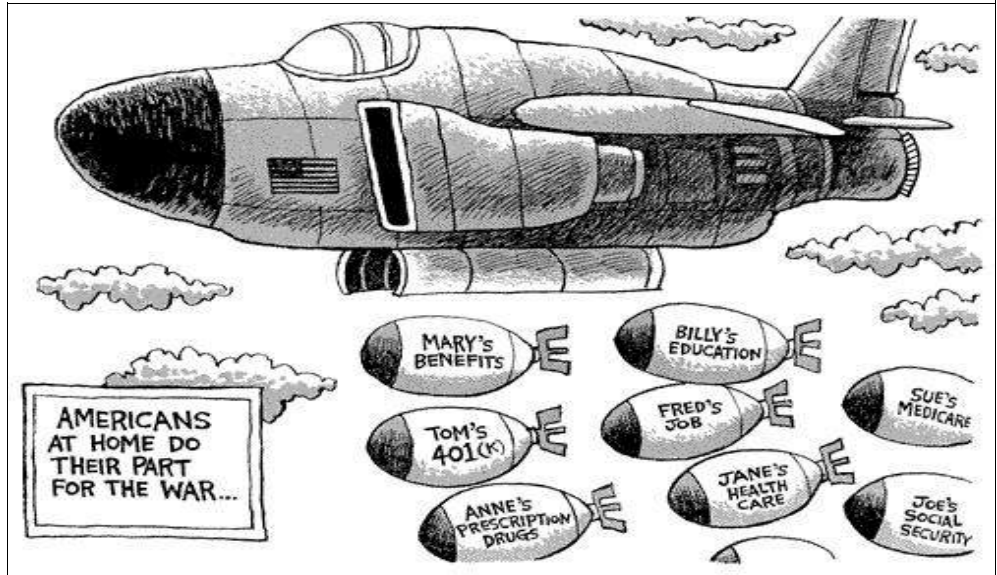
clude a PEOPLE Convention on Friday night. Anyone who is a PEOPLE VIP will be admitted free of charge or anyone who signs up to be a PEOPLE VIP the day of the event will be admitted free of charge. Training classes addressing a variety of issues will be held from 8 am until noon on Saturday. On Sunday morning, the annual Women's Committee Breakfast will be held with guest speaker to be announced. The Council 25 Convention will include voting on key issues and policies affecting not only AFSCME 411 but also locals throughout the state. As a delegate, you will be entitled to vote one/fifth of the AFSCME 411 votes on these issues. Anyone interested in being a delegate must attend the membership meeting on September 3rd where nominations will take place. Sign Up for PEOPLE Payroll Deduction

AFSCME 411 now has payroll deduction for enrollment in the PEOPLE program. PEOPLE is the political fundraiser for AFSCME in the State of Michigan. If you sign up for payroll deduction for PEOPLE, \$1 a week will be deducted from your paycheck for participation in this program. There are numerous benefits to members who participate in the PEOPLE program. The first year of participation and immediately upon signing up, members receive a PEOPLE jacket and pin. Every year following, gifts such as shirts, tote bags and jackets are given to participating members.

Examples of the first year jacket and pin are available in the union office. Members are also entitled to free admission to the PEOPLE Reception at the Council 25 Convention and at the annual PEOPLE Convention. Both of these events include entertainment, food and beverages. The best part is you are enabling AFSCME 411 to actively participate in the political process and get people elected to office who will be making decisions that affect our members.
